From Bishop Delores J. Williamston – Louisiana Conference of the UMC - May 01, 2024

The General Conference of the United Methodist Church voted to remove harmful language from our Book of Discipline, found in ¶304.3 regarding qualifications for licensed or ordained ministry that had state: "The United Methodist Church does not condone the practice of homosexuality and considers this practice incompatible with Christian teaching. Therefore, self-avowed practicing homosexuals are not to be

certified as candidates, ordained as ministers, or appointed to serve in The United Methodist Church."

There was additional legislation that prevents District Superintendents and Bishops from penalizing pastors and churches that perform or allow a same-gender wedding on their church campus adding, to ¶ 419.

This same petition prevents punishment if a pastor or church chooses not to perform or allow a same-gender wedding on their church campus. Essentially this removes a restriction and allows both clergy and churches to follow their consciences and their understanding of scripture without fear of repercussion.

Words are powerful. We see this reflected over and over again in scripture. These words have been used to exclude and harm since they were added to our Discipline in 1972.

In light of that, we first want to acknowledge the deep harm and pain the "incompatibility" language has caused for our LGBTQIA+ siblings in Christ and their families. To consider any human being incompatible with the teachings of Christ is harmful and dangerous. We lament the exclusion, pain, and hurt this has inflicted and perpetuated.

The change became effective May 4, 2024, following the close of General Conference.

For many in our Conference, the question then becomes, what does this mean for us?

This will not change our appointive process. This means that the Bishop and Cabinet will consult with clergy and Staff/Pastor Parish Relations Committees to find the best missional appointment for both the church and the pastor.

This will not change a clergyperson's right to discern whether or not to marry a couple.

This addition to the Discipline protects clergy regardless of whether or not they officiate a same-gender wedding.

This will not change a local church's ability to discern how marriage ceremonies are conducted at their churches.

Wear RED on Pentecost Sunday – May 19, 2024




On Pentecost Sunday, we remember the day the disciples received the Holy Spirit in a special way. The story in Acts 2 describes a powerful wind and tongues of fire as the Holy Spirit was poured out on people from all over the world who came to Jerusalem to celebrate a Jewish feast. At the first Pentecost over 3000 people were baptized, creating the first church. This is why Pentecost is known as the birthday of the Christian church.

The word Pentecost comes from a Greek word meaning fiftieth. The Jewish Festival of Pentecost (called Shavuot, meaning "weeks" in Hebrew) falls on the fiftieth day after the original Passover. On that day, God gave the Torah to Moses on Mount Sinai. The

Christian festival of Pentecost falls on the 50th day after the resurrection of Jesus.

Red is historically associated with Pentecost as a visual reminder of the "tongues of fire" that empowered the apostles and others to proclaim the good news of Christ's resurrection in many languages to the crowds of pilgrims from many lands (Acts 2:3). **You are invited to wear RED on Pentecost Sunday – May 19th**.
